ISLE AU HAUT HISTORICAL COLLECTIONS MEETING Saturday, August 8, 2009 Revere Memorial Library

Pat Cole brought up her interest in finding ways to attract and involve new members to the Collections committee. Marie Hamly asked whether obtaining 501-3C status might not be an attraction for donors, but was informed that Pat's research into the subject revealed it would be too costly for us to undertake the necessary legal work. Barbara Brown reminded us we already have a wealth of material consisting of oral histories and news articles that should be of great interest to island residents. Pat repeated that we have to give people a reason to join our group.

Fred Eustis wondered if we could have a public event to draw attention to our mission. Stanley French was mentioned as a possible source to present a program on the island. Several members stated that Fred would also be an excellent presenter. Sharen Wilson suggested contacting Dr. Speiss from the University of Maine to give us his anthropological information. After several other suggestions for public programs, it was decided to form an Events Committee with Pat Cole, Barbara Brown, Sharen Wilson and Fred Eustis as members to give the group inspiration for a series of public events designed to attract membership to our group.

Betsy Doermann reported that the Park Service island history project had not materialized and nothing further had been heard from them.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was **VOTED: To accept the minutes of the August 29, 2008** meeting as circulated.
