## Collection is on Sundays Garbage should be out by 8:00 am

**HOUSEHOLD TRASH -** ONE (1) clear plastic bag up to 33 gallon size per household, less than 40 pounds.

- Tie all 4 corners of bag securely, and double bag if heavy.
- No food; paper; glass; tin cans; sharp objects; liquor, wine or beer containers, returnables or bags that contain only Styrofoam in the garbage.
- The Stonington transfer station will not accept construction waste.
- Paint cans are accepted as long as the lids are off and the paint is dry.
- No broken or unbroken glass or light bulbs: Place in cardboard or other sealed and secured container to shield the sharp edges. Place alongside your trash bag.
- Leaky bags, bags with items not allowed. Bags containing sharp objects will be left behind.

**RECYCLABLES** – Glass, tin cans, non-returnable bottles: Please separate these items from trash and sort into separate containers that you will keep

- BOTTLES and JARS: must be empty and clean with covers and caps removed.
- NEWS PAPERS and MAGAZINE: Bundle up to 8" and tie well enough to be tossed several times during transit. Can also be boxed and secured. Keep dry.
- CARDBOARD: Tie tightly with a secure knot to withstand rough treatment, placed in a cardboard box, or bagged in heavy duty bag. Keep dry.
- No waxed boxes please.
- TIN and ALUMINUM: All containers must be empty and clean.

## DIAPERS

Remove waste, <u>double bag</u> and keep separate from other items.
